

The 15th Fukushima Learning Community and

the 3rd Fukushima Rebirth Community School



It will soon be 14 years since the Great East Japan Earthquake in March 2011 and the Fukushima nuclear power plant accident. In April 2023, the Fukushima International Research and Education Institute (F-REI) will open in Namie Town. The institute was conceived as a "knowledge base" for creative reconstruction, the basic principle of Fukushima's recovery. ALPS-treated water was discharged into the ocean. Also, in November 2024, fuel debris was removed from Unit 2 for the first time on a trial basis.

Waseda University established the Waseda University Fukushima Hamadori Future Creation Research Center in May 2017 based on a cooperation agreement with the town of Hirono in Fukushima Prefecture and has been conducting research and studies with the local community on the reconstruction and decommissioning of Fukushima from a long-term and broad perspective. In January 2019, we announced the Fukushima Hamadori Social Innovation Initiative Concept (SI Initiative) which aims to form a sustainable Hamadori region in Fukushima Prefecture by 2050 and has been working with the following groups: (1) 1F decommissioning Study Group: research and study on the future vision of 1F decommissioning and the regional resources of 1F decommissioning process; (2) creative reconstruction study group: research and study on the new knowledge (2) Creative Reconstruction Study Group: Research and study on the formation of new knowledge creation and social innovation through the collaboration of science, politics, and society.

In parallel with these study group activities, we hold **Fukushima Gaku Kai (Learning Community)** as a "place for dialogue" to think together about the reconstruction and decommissioning of Fukushima, transcending generations, regions, and fields. In July 2022, we concluded a cooperation agreement with Fukushima Prefectural Futaba Mirai Gakuen Junior and Senior High Schools. We launched the **1F Community School** as a "place for dialogue" = "place for learning" regarding the 1F decommissioning policy. In April 2024, we concluded a cooperation agreement with the town of Tomioka in Fukushima Prefecture and Futaba Corporation to establish the **Fukushima Rebirth School**, where science, politics, and society collaborate to consider Fukushima reconstruction.

The 15th Fukushima Gaku (Raku) Kai and the 3rd Fukushima Rebuilding School will be held under the theme "The Past, Present, and Future of Fukushima Reconstruction: Where did we come from, who are we, and where are we going?" We would like to have a broad and deep dialogue about **the necessity and importance of establishing higher education institutions in the Hamadori region of Fukushima Prefecture**, especially in areas beyond generations, fields, and regions.
